Developmental Screenings

For children birth- 32 months of age

*As a parent, you may wonder if your infant or toddler is learning and growing in the way you expect. Your infant or toddler's growth can be screened free of charge using the parent-friendly Ages and Stages or Ages and Stages Social-Emotional Questionnaire.**

What is a screening?

*A screening is a quick look at how your child is learning and growing. Different kinds of activities and questions will be used to learn how to best help your child.**

The areas which will be screened are:

- *the development of your child's motor skills*
- *thinking and language skills*
- *self-help skills*
- *emotional growth*

A screening allows us to decide:

- *if your child's development is fine at this point;*
- *if a follow-up screening needs to be scheduled;*
- *if a referral to other helpful sources will be made; or*
- *if your child's development should be looked at more closely (evaluation).*

**(You do not have need to have a concern about your child's development to have a screening... a screening is a great tool to look at where your child is at developmentally and where they are going!)*
